CAREVIEW360 AT A GLANCE

WHO Any patient with two or more chronic conditions.

WHEN Any office visits for chronic care patients, new patient visits, post-hospital follow-ups (TCM visits), Annual Wellness Visits, or those with known compliance issues are ideal.

FREQUENCY Medicare allows the test to be completed 12 times per year, however, quarterly is typically sufficient.

INSURANCE The test is covered by Medicare Part B and most Medicare Advantage plans.







HOW DO I READ THE RESULTS REPORT?



The first page of the report includes a summary of the findings and can be interpreted at a glance. The screening results are conveniently grouped into three categories:
